A Heartbeat For Missions

From the day Southeastern began, its heartbeat has been for missions—World missions. One of our major goals has been the planting of Free Will Baptist churches around the world—in our homeland and the regions beyond.

In our short history, we have seen some great results in our efforts to reach that goal. Hemant Patel, and Becky, his wife, went to Agra, India, 10 years ago to begin a work there. They knew no one there. Today there are two beautiful churches in that area of India with combined attendance of over 300. Hemant told me this week that he baptized four this past Sunday (October 31). He now has an institute where he

is training his preacher boys who have answered the call of God to go into full-time ministry. A number of young men who attend the university there, from Kenya, Africa, have been saved and are now studying for the ministry. It is truly an amazing work.

Recently, I spent a week in Moldova where Chip and Elizabeth Henley minister in overseeing fourteen churches that are there in that formerly Communist part of the world. I was so impressed with those local pastors and their dedication and sacrifice to build those local churches. Now some of those churches are starting other churches. The total ministry there is a wonderful sight

to behold.

It was obvious that Chip and his wife were a God-send to that work. Now David and Cindy Austin are heavily involved in completing the building which will be used as an institute to train the nationals for the ministry God has called them into. It is obvious that David is where he needs to be and is doing an outstanding job.

It was such a blessing to sit in Candy Bruce Corlata and Shanna Newman's classrooms and hear them teach English using stories from the Bible to illustrate English sentence structure and diagramming. And to think, a few years ago, all those classrooms were used

to teach Communism. They have an amazing and unique ministry.

Andy and Andrea Moore are working in South America with the Aycocks and doing a fine job there—we are very proud of them.

Glen Clementi and his family are now serving in Keiv, Ukraine.

Teri Cahoon is on the field in Thailand.

Other graduates are planting churches in a number of American cities and have

growing ministries. There is Greg Floars in Gwinn, Michigan, Bill Reynolds in Rhode Island, Don Bailey in Texas, Jim Fairchild in Arkansas, Billy Bevan, Jr. in Georgia, and Ral Alsbrook in Charlotte, North Carolina.

We thank God for His leadership in guiding our graduates to the various fields they are now laboring. Our desire is to see more of our graduates heading toward cities around the world to start more Free Will Baptist Churches.

Notes from the Mission Field

October 28, 2004

Last night, I was abruptly awakened by what sounded like two explosions, both of which were followed by a horrific shudder of the building. I just knew the diesel-run boiler had exploded and that the building was coming down around me. It was only after I finally reached the front door, found the proper key, and talked with the guard outside (who assured me that it was "just an earthquake" and that everything was fine) that I realized the only thing still shaking was me! When I settled back into bed to try to get back to sleep, portions of the following verse kept running through my mind: "The LORD reigneth; let the people tremble: he sitteth between the cherubims; let the earth be moved." (Psalm 99:1) I was definitely trembling and the earth had definitely moved. The Lord is in control, and He was just showing some of His mighty power. I've been thinking lately on His power and the fact that He is in control of all that's happening, so I eventually drifted off to sleep with a prayer on my heart for those closer to the source who may have

experienced even stronger tremors (ours was about 5.8 on the Richter scale) and thanksgiving to Lord for protection and restored peace.

I did receive the Bibles for my students last week and am planning a special lesson with them following fall break, which is the first week of November. We will have a cultural lesson involving the Pilgrims, Thanksgiving, and God's blessing on America being a result of the founders' faith in Him. I plan to challenge them with the plan of salvation and with the fact that they are capable of making a difference in the future of their own country by trusting in the Lord Jesus Christ and living to please Him. Please be in prayer with me about this. I have a couple of classes that are very difficult for me, as there are several boys that constantly talk and mock me. Lack of discipline in the schools and homes here cause serious problems for those of us who don't slap or shout at students, and it seems to get worse each year.

Thank you for your continued prayers and support, and may God bless you with His peace and protection as you glorify Him.

A special note for those who email me: If you have sent me a message within the past few months and I did not answer it, that's because I was having an email problem and didn't receive it. I was wondering why folks suddenly stopped emailing me! The problem has been corrected (I hope), and I beg your forgiveness for not responding. I'm looking forward to hearing from you again, and I will respond!

Glenn Clementi, Kiev, Ukraine

Village life brought our family closer together. From August through September existence in the Ukraine was very challenging yet extremely interesting. For two months, we lived without running water, no heat & enjoyed the sounds & smells of farm animals. The village folks seemed to not have a care in the world other than subsistence. The most interesting part of our week was bath-day. Debbie & I would gather 4-6 buckets of water from the neighbor's well, heat 1/3rd of it on the gas stove, and bathe the children & ourselves in an outside, makeshift shower. Thankfully, the weather was very co-

operative & we never took an outside shower when it was too chilly. A few cold nights brought us close together as the children joined us in our bedroom & we all slept comfy & cozy. After two months of this life-changing experience, we finally moved into an apartment inside the city limits of Kiev. Running water & heat are so wonderful!

Ministry life for Debbie is blessed & challenging. This year she has volunteered at the Kiev Christian Academy as their second grade teacher. She teaches our daughter, Nadia & 11 other children. Nikki, our oldest child is in the 3rd grade. Michael is preschool age & stays at home.

The building project of "The Timothy House" is moving forward. We have finished construction on the foundation. With winter just around the corner, we are drying in the basement & waiting for spring before we continue building the ministry center.

Our church-planting ministries are moving forward as we continue to meet with Ukrainians to pray & study God's word. 2 of the 3 Ukrainian men involved in our Kiev ministry are leading 2 new church plants. We are also doing a 3rd church-plant in Kiev. We are thankful to be a

part of an active group of Ukrainian men who believe in establishing churches.

ence for the kids of our churches. Let me introduce some of them to you. There's Crystal, a freshman whom I



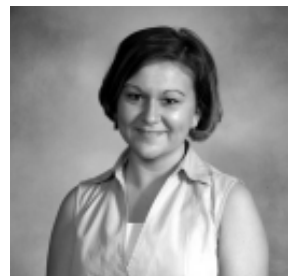

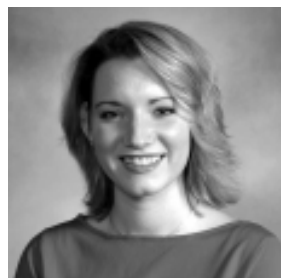

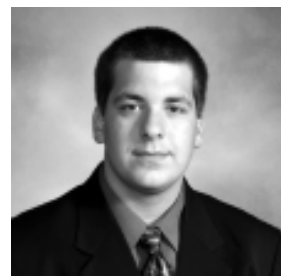

Ken Lane ('93) and wife Kristal, pastoring in Virginia, now have 4 children with 1 on the way.

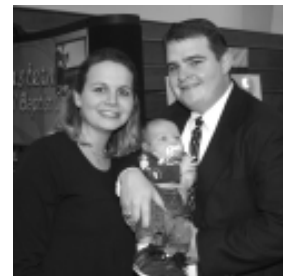
Devin ('93) and Starla ('92) Hudson and Matt ('93) and Ericka ('95) Pettit and their children are headed to Las Vegas to plant a church.

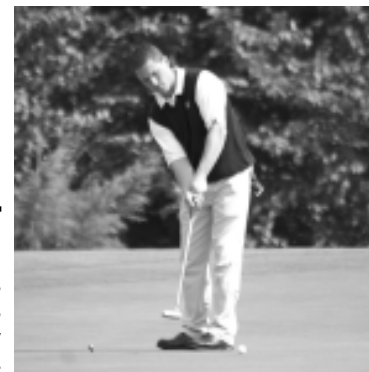

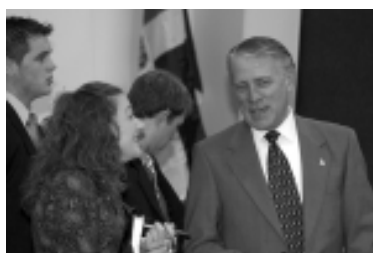
