President's Pen



I THINK I'LL JUST QUIT

DR. LORENZA STOX

Have you ever thought about quitting—throwing in the towel? I must say that the temptation is often there. It happens to college students, teachers, laymen and even pastors. You preach and pour your life into the lives of others while they seemingly ignore all that you teach and preach. People disappoint you and you conclude, "What's the use?"

When we are in the will of God, doing His work, we should never quit. I'm not about to quit. Get Discouraged? Yes. Get Disappointed? Yes. But quit? Never!

Here are a few reasons

we must not quit:

1. Some people do listen. Thank God for those who do listen to the preacher—those who listen to godly, mature leaders. Although it may appear that folks are not listening, some are, and because of that you cannot quit.

People disappoint you and you conclude, "What's the use?"

2. Although no one may listen, I am relieved to know that my hands are clean of those who don't listen. The responsibility of the preacher, the leader,

is to give the warning. If they do not listen, my hands are clean. (Ezekiel 33:7-9). Ezekiel preached to ears of stone, but he preached.

3. The less one listens to me now, the more they will need me later and I don't want to disappoint them. I want to be there for them. I want to be a faithful watchman, a faithful preacher who will "Cry aloud, spare not, lift up thy voice like a trumpet, and shew my people their transgression." Isaiah 58:1.

4. Although it may appear no one is listening, some of what is said is

taking root. The seed will be planted and one day the fruit of the seed will be known.

Get Discouraged? Yes.
Get Disappointed? Yes.
But quit? Never!

5. I will have been faithful and stood. "Moreover it is required in stewards, that a man be found faithful." (I Corinthians 4:2). No matter how others re-

spond or what they do, I can still be faithful. I must be faithful if I am to please my Savior.

When one has determined God's will for their life—the college, the ministry, the mate, the move from that position is a very dangerous decision. It will not only affect your life, but the lives of others whom you influence.

Don't quit? People are counting on you.
