Dolly's Dream

Summer time is financially difficult for colleges like Southeastern. There is little student income and gifts often drop. Since we do not receive any government aid and student income and gifts are our only source of income, summers are very challenging. Each year, I try my best to raise the \$250,000 that we need for the summer, and God usually provides it somehow.

In the summer of 2007, we faced the same dilemma. I prayed daily and spoke with many men about helping and received no money. I was getting very concerned and, I guess, worried. Obviously, it was taking its toll on me, and Dolly observed it. We discussed my burden, and often she would get alone to think and pray about the situation.

One day she came to me and told me she had the solution to the financial dilemma. She stated God gave her this plan, and she was to call it "The Nehemiah Club." Taken from the book of Nehemiah in rebuilding the wall, her dream was to build a wall of support for Southeastern that would provide residual income.

Her plan: Get 50 pastors as captains, who would enroll 30 people each from their congregation and friends. Her mission was to enlist an army of Nehemiah Club members who

would be willing to pledge blocks of \$20 a month or \$240 a year above what they were giving to Southeastern. If that dream were fulfilled, it would bring in \$360,000 a year – More than enough to carry us through the summer. 1500 members x \$20 x 12 months = \$360,000.

Dolly was sure she could get the 50 preachers, though she was so disappointed at many of their responses, she never gave up hope. The Nehemiah Club has grown and is growing. Her dying concern for the college was to see the Nehemiah Club be successful. She worked on it many days in the last few months of her life. It was what she lived for. She did say in her closing days, "maybe God can use my death to bring it to pass."

Dolly's motto and marching orders were "Many hands make light work; few hands make hard work," and it is so true.

I do not want to see Dolly's dream die. Let's pick up her mantle and stay with it until the job is finished.

time the couple also began serving at Southeastern Free Will Baptist College again.

Though she was certainly a faithful and dedicated pastor's wife and teacher, it did not take long for the ministry of the college to truly capture Mrs. Dolly's heart. Southeastern was Mrs. Dolly's passion - so much so that in 2007 she founded The Nehemiah Club,

Dr. Stox and Mrs. Dolly formed a wonderful team that was truly passionate about the ministry of Southeastern Free Will Baptist College. Dr. Stox says that as a wife, Mrs. Dolly was "submissive, a servant of servants; she lived to serve her Lord and help in my ministry and to make me look good." This statement could certainly serve as a formula for any wife to help build a successful marriage. Mrs. Dolly's entire life was a picture of what a godly helpmeet should be.

Gene Williams, her pastor for many years, described having her as a church member as "a unique privilege." Everyone who knew Mrs. Dolly was aware of her deep joy, her cheerful spirit, and her love for Southeastern, her husband, and Jesus Christ. Even during her eight-year battle with cancer, Mrs. Dolly focused on her goal- building the wall and serving God for as long as she was possibly able.

Mrs. Dolly Stox was born on November 29, 1943. She grew up in Pitt County, North Carolina, and inherited a solid work ethic which was put to use on her family's farm. In the eighth grade, she met Lorenza Stox. The two were smitten with what her husband would later call "puppy love," but did not date seriously until later on in high school.

When Lorenza went off to college, his high school sweetheart was out of sight but certainly not out of mind. The two were married on June 17, 1962.

Bound by their love for each other and for Christ, Lorenza and Dolly served at ministries in Charlotte, Goldsboro, and New Bern, North Carolina. During this time Dolly received her Bachelor's degree from Campbell University and the Lord blessed the Stox family with two children through adoption - Stephen in 1970 and Tammy in 1977. Dr. Stox described Mrs. Dolly as "a perfect example of a godly mother."

In 1983, Dolly and Lorenza were the first employees of the newly formed Southeastern Free Will Baptist College. Eventually, the Lord led them to Parkers Chapel Free Will Baptist Church in Greenville, North Carolina, where Dr. Stox was the pastor for many years. During this

These words of wisdom were more than words- they were the way Mrs. Dolly lived and served her husband and her Savior.

It has been said, "When I give you my time, I give you my life." We dedicate this issue of *The Standard* to Mrs. Dolly Stox. Thank you for giving us your life.

Time To Withdraw

After 23 years of being the Pastor of the same church and 30 years in ministry, I had hit a wall. I was not only physically, emotional, mentally and spiritual exhausted; I was empty. Like a car that had run out of gas. I was laboring with a dull axe, and I could not disengage from things long enough to sharpen it. My faith had not wavered, but I was wondering if I could or should even continue in the ministry any longer.

Many times when pastors run out of gas and hit the wall, they generally do one of four things: they resign and move to another church; they quit the ministry; they get sick; or they do something stupid. I came very close to doing all four. I am so glad that I opted for another choice. I decided that it was time to withdraw, I took a sabbatical leave.

Luke 5:16 states: "And he (Jesus) withdrew himself into the wilderness and prayed." In this verse we find Jesus doing something in His ministry that is not often talked about but is greatly needed. No, it is not praying, though that is so vital in our lives. How we need to pray. But what Jesus did that we often forget, but He greatly needed to do, was that ". . . he withdrew himself. . . ."

Six times in the gospels, Matthew 14:22-23; Mark 1:35; 6:46; Luke 4:42; 5:16; 6:12 we find Jesus withdrawing Himself from the multitude of people that He ministered to. The demands upon Him were so great that His own ministry was punctuated with times of withdrawal from the people, the problems, and the pressures. Yes, the Word became flesh and dwelt among man, but He also knew when to withdraw Himself from being around man. Blessed is the minister who knows he needs to take the time to withdraw himself into the wilderness for a time of refreshing and renewal.

When Jesus withdrew himself from the crowds to the wilderness, it was usually for several hours or overnight in order to rest and be refreshed. Over the years I have faithfully taken a day off in the week, enjoyed a couple of weeks of vacation during the year, and even gone to conferences. However, I always took with me the cares of the church, got phone calls from needy church members while I was away, made phone calls to needy church members while I was away, dealt with emergencies that would come up, or had to return early because of a tragedy or death in the church family. The problems and pressure and demands of people never seemed to cease. Even in those times when Jesus tried to withdraw for several hours, there were those trying to get to Him for His help. Luke 4:42 tells us that the people sought Him. According to Mark 1:37, once when Jesus got away, His disciples found Him and said unto Him, All men seek for thee. What preacher does

not know what that is like? Honestly, I found myself understanding the psalmist David and what he penned in Psalm 55:6: "Oh that I had wings like a dove; for then I would fly away and be at rest." I needed that, and it was time to do it. Blessed is the minister who knows when he needs to take the time to withdraw himself into the wilderness for a time of refreshing and renewal and will do it.

For a long time I knew I needed to withdraw. It was how I could take the time to do it that I could not figure out. How could I be away from the church? How could I put my responsibilities on others? How could I walk away from the pressing needs that my people had? What would people say about it? How could I afford to be away for an extended period of time? A thousand questions went through my mind that I tried to answer, but I never did. However, by God's grace, the help of a great staff, the support of godly deacons, and a loving church, I withdrew for five weeks.

Blessed is the minister who knows he needs to take the time to withdraw himself into the wilderness for a time of refreshing and renewal.

The benefits were great. I was able to spend quality time resting. Having a free schedule with no meetings to attend, no sermons to prepare, no visits to make, no counseling sessions to hold, no classes to teach, no problems to solve allowed for much relaxation, sleep and rest for my body and mind. I was able to invest much more quality time with my wife. Instead of focusing so much of my time on my min-

istry, I was able to focus on her and our marriage. Laurie and I spent more time talking and laughing and crying and reading and praying together than we had in a long time. Evenings generally scheduled with meetings became times to be at home with her. Just being able to do some little things together, like sitting together in church was such a joy. It was such a rewarding time for both of us.

Each Sunday as I visited other churches, I was enriched by God's Word being preached. It was strange but rewarding to be preached to and not to be preaching. Since I was not preaching for five weeks, I did not have to invest hours in sermon preparation. So I read for my own personal growth, spent long periods of time praying for the church and my family, and went through a very life changing DVD series entitled Quieting The Noisy Soul.

What did my withdrawal do for me? It relaxed me, refreshed me, renewed me, refocused me, revived me, and most of all kept me in the ministry. Blessed is the minister who knows when he needs to take the time to withdraw himself into the wilderness for a time of refreshing and renewal and does it.

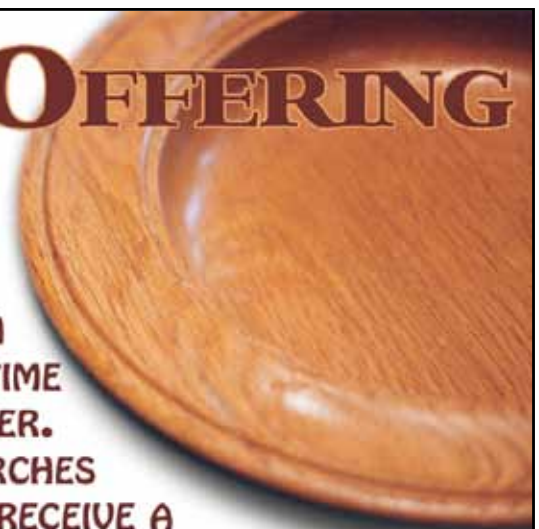
